Maybe this will help from Mac Brown, Bryson City. It takes only five seconds to say "begin slow, and smoothly accelerate toward a sudden stop with the rod high." Acceleration means starting slowly and smoothly, and delaying the fast for the very end of the stroke.

Enjoy your time on the water fishing by improving your casting skills.

FLY FISHING ETIQUETTE

I have found over my many years of fishing that fly fishermen are typically a very courteous breed. Very seldom have I been pushed out of my fishing spot and have rarely seen littering, cursing or other offensive acts. That said, there are some unwritten rules and guidelines that we should all be aware of. I have researched these on the internet and will share a few each month in the newsletter.

Who has the right of way?

According to several articles on the internet, the person working upstream has the right-of-way over the person working downstream. If you encounter someone working upstream, you should get out of the river and walk around below him, staying far enough away from the stream so as not to spook the fish.

An angler fighting a fish has the right of way. Reel in your line and try to stay out of their way while they fight their fish. Many times the angler with the fish on is trying very hard to keep out of your space but sometimes circumstances won't allow it. It's totally appropriate to ask the angler with the fish on if they would like you to net the fish for them. Many new friendships have started this way.

Wilson Creek Survey

If you spend much time fishing Wilson Creek, especially on weekends, you know that it is getting a lot of pressure. The Hickory NC TU chapter is developing a survey to determine how we can improve the fishing experience there. We will be using the results of the survey to talk with the NCDNR about how to improve the Delayed Harvest fishing area to support the ever growing number of fly fishers.
